

Why GEPA? Gender Equality in Public Administration Matters



Women have the right to participate in decision-making

Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Beijing Platform for Action, ECOSOC, UNDP Gender Equality Strategy



PA should be representative of society and tap into the full potential of the workforce



Women's equal participation in decision-making including in PA contributes to development





GEPA: Gender Equality in Public Administration



UNDP's Gender Equality in Public Administration (GEPA) initiated in 2011, led to the first Global Report in 2014

Data on 35 countries + 13 case studies



Anchored by 2030 Development Agenda

 Indicator 16.7.1b: measures the proportionality of women's representation at all levels of the public service



GEPA Working Group at the University of Pittsburgh since 2015

- 20-25 graduate students per year
- Collectively, 1500+ research hours per academic year
- Gender Equality in the UN course option since 2019




Gen-PaCS: Number of Countries with Data








Gen-PaCS: Women's Participation in Public Administration Globally












Health Ministries: Women's Share of Decision-Making Positions







GEPA & COVID-19 Response Highlights in Asia-Pacific: Philippines

- The Civil Service Commission issued flexible work arrangements:
 - work-from home
 - skeleton workforce
 - four-day workweek
 - flexible working hours
- Work from home granted to employees who:
 - are younger than 21 or older than 60
 - have health risks
 - are pregnant
 - are in quarantine











Summary of Findings





Globally: Women in Decision-Making Positions in the Health Sector

Question 1: To what extent are women participating and leading the administrative response to COVID-19?


- The health sector is often feminized but gender parity in decisionmaking in health ministries remains rare
- Women hold high-profile positions in health agencies, even in countries where women are otherwise absent from leadership






Globally: Women Underrepresented on COVID-19 Task Forces

Question 2: How are public administrations contributing to women's safety and enabling women's work during the pandemic?

- Most common across all regions: Gender-based violence policies
 - Increased assistance and awareness campaigns
- Less common across all regions: Economic and work-life balance policies
 - OECD leads on economic policies
 - ECIS and OECD lead on work-life balance policies
